



SAFETY RULES FOR THE FLOORING CUTTER

- 1. READ AND UNDERSTAND THIS INSTRUCTION MANUAL BEFORE OPERATING THE D-CUT MULTI-FLOORING CUTTERS.
- 2. If you are not thoroughly familiar with the operation of D-Cut Multi-flooring Cutter, obtain advice from a qualified instructor or call 800-982-3434 USA
- 3. Stay alert. Do not operate while under the influence of drugs, alcohol, or medication.
- 4. Always wear safety approved eye protection with side shields(ANSI Z87.1)
- 5. Keep work area free of debris.
- 6. Keep children and unauthorized persons away from the D-Cut Multi-flooring Cutter and work area.
- 7. Make sure tool is secure. Operate only on a firm substrate or solid stand.
- 8. Use the right tool. Do not force the D-Cut Multi-flooring Cutter or use it for a job for which it was not designed; use only on approved materials.
- 9. Keep the tungsten steel blade sharp. A cracked blade will not perform properly. Note: Our blade does not need re-sharpening.
- 10. Always keep hands away from blade while operating or carrying the cutter.
- 11. Do not alter or misuse this tool. The D-Cut Multi-flooring Cutter is precision built; modifications not specified in this manual may result in a dangerous and unsafe environment.
- 12. Maintain the D-Cut Multi-flooring Cutter with care. Keep Blade sharp and clean. Follow instructions for changing accessories.
- 13. Use only recommended accessories. The use of improper accessories may be hazardous and cause injuries.
- 14. Never leave the D-Cut Multi-flooring Cutter unattended. Secure the handle with the lock chain when not in use.


SET UP






Installation of the Cutter (1) Install the cross bar to the cutter base with the provided bolt as shown.

Warning: Do not put your fingers against the sharp edge of the blade at any time.



Installation of the Cutter (2) Insert the handle to the base and install the rear base to the front base with the provided screws as shown.

Warning: Do not put your fingers against the sharp edge of the blade at any time.




Working Table

Install the working table as shown.

Warning: Do not put your fingers against the sharp edge of the blade at any time.






Cutting Preparation

Place the angle attachment into the cutter head and push it as much as you can to the bottom. Change the cutting angle 0° or 45° as needed. After the attachment is set up, lock it as shown.


Warning: Do not put your fingers against the sharp edge of the blade at any time.



Cutting (1)

Insert material between the cutting blade and the base as shown and hold the material with the flooring holding bar, then push handle down to complete a cut.

Warning: Maintain control of the handle. Do not allow handle to slam back after making a cut.




Cutting (2)

Install the 0-45° Attachment as shown. Insert material and hold the material with the flooring holding bar, then push handle down to complete a cut.

Warning: Maintain control of the handle. Do not allow handle to slam back after making a cut.




MAINTENANCE



Changing the BladeUse the provided Allan wrench to remove the six screws, then hold the blade by each end and carefully remove the blade out of the blade holder.

Note: The flat side of the blade faces the table.

Warning: Do not put your fingers against the sharp edge of the blade at any time.




Transport

Hook the chain to the ring on the handle and carry the cutter as shown.

Warning: Do not put your fingers against the sharp edge of the blade at any time.
